## **Special Meeting:**

Presented by SOC Chair, Sherry Cornell

- A history of the HDNA's interactions with Parks regarding the Douglass Community Center and the subsequent formation of the ad hoc committee, Save Our Center were presented.
- Current actions on the part of Metro Parks and its director, including a public "exaggeration" of mold levels, indicate a continued intention to ignore our efforts to

- secure the future of the center and pursue their own agenda which has not been made known to the HDNA.
- A lively discussion followed the report with many ideas discussed including writing a letter to the mayor and writing a letter to Metro Council.
- The meeting was interrupted by DCC staff due to the late hour, but two motions were put forward.
  - O To continue to support the efforts of the SOC with 24 hours notice and opportunity to reply before any public actions are taken. Passed with one opposed.
  - O To pursue local landmark designation. Passed with two abstentions.
